





Knobbed Cylinders


Red Rods



Globes




One globe has colored continents, the other has sandpaper land forms

World Puzzle Map




You will eventually need the whole set that includes all the continents, ideally with a map holder.


Movable Alphabet

Pink Series Large Cards To use with the Movable Alphabet




we recreated these authentic cards from our original cards from Dr. Montessori's own London Institute class. The pale background color is original and it is easier on the eyes for reading.



Next year, you will need a full set of Golden Beads, so you do not need to buy this separately.

Montessori Mats

Solid color, dark, contrast with equipment, no lines or patterns

Dimensions: About 20 x 29 inches. Color: Medium green Use: Table work with beads Dimensions: About 49 x 29 inches. Color: Dark green Use: Floor work

These are the original mat specifications. The best mats are made with 100% felted wool, but polyblends work. They are impossible to find, so we suggest buying the fabric and cutting it.
